- 1. Call to Order at 1:20pm
- 2. New Business
 - A. FY20 Funding Requests
 - The clubs scheduled for today presented their funding requests.
 - B. FY20 Funding Discussion
 - The FY20 budget projection is \$93,803 available to clubs for allocation based on an FYE of 3,175 credits. There are a total of \$145,144 in requests including \$36,350 in travel requests. Taking out ½ of the travel requested (\$18,175) would bring the new total to \$126,969. This is \$33,166 more than what is projected.
 - The board is concerned about club participation. Clubs will be required to have a flyer posted on the Student Senate bulletin board. Clubs should be reporting about club activities at the Student Senate meeting. They can submit this by email if unable to attend.
 - Sue made a motion to fund the five following clubs as they followed directions and kept their funding requests under \$1,000 per semester: BP Vets, Latino, Outdoors, Media Storm, Hands On Ink, Kinsey seconded. Motion passed.
 - Sheila made a motion to only fund a maximum of \$500 per club per semester for food, excluding Latino Club and Senates. Dylan seconded. Motion passed.
 - #1 SkillsUSA BPC—Sue suggested that we reduce their budget to 5 attendees with the understanding that they can request more funding if needed. \$6,500 per semester, \$13,000 per SkillsUSA organization. Dylan motioned to fund EP and BP SkillsUSA at \$13,000 per year (\$6,500 per semester), Jonathan seconded. Motion passed.
 - EP Vets—Jonathan made a motion to reduce the EP Vets Club supply budget by \$100 per semester to make their total request to \$1000 per semester, Kinsey seconded. Motion passed.
 - Landscape—Dylan made a motion to not fund their request due to the club missing the appointment to present their budget, the motion died for the lack of a second. Kinsey made a new motion to cut their request to \$1,000 per semester, Adam seconded. Motion passed.
 - Dental— Kinsey made a motion to fund \$125 for fall and \$1250 for spring, Serhii seconded. Discussion around club missing the appointment to present their budget and lack of detail presented in written budget, Motion passed.

- BP Senate—Sue made a motion to reduce their student activities to \$250 and to eliminate the supply budget of \$1,125 each semester, Serhii seconded. Motion failed. Kinsey made a new motion to reduce their student activities to \$250 and to change their supply budget to \$500 each semester, Serhii seconded. Motion passed.
- Audio—Angelina made a motion to cut the \$1,500 from the fall semester budget for the PA system, Jonathan seconded. Motion passed.
- Culinary—Serhii made a motion to cut speakers from both semesters, and all travel membership and registration from fall semester, Peter seconded. Discussion around club missing the appointment to present their budget and lack of detail presented in written budget, Motion passed.
- IOPP—Peter made a motion to fund \$2,500 for Fall and \$500 for Spring, Kinsey seconded. Motion passed.
- Senate EP—Sue made a motion to approve the same amount for EP as BP, Jonathan seconded. Motion passed.
- Ford Asset—Jonathan made a motion to reduce the Ford Asset request by \$750 for the graduation food, Angelina seconded Discussion around this very grey area of club and program. Club will be advised to use fundraising dollars for the food for this event. Motion passed.
- Phi Theta Kappa—Jonathan made a motion to cut the membership from each semester for \$1,250, Angelina seconded. Discussion around the Stole purchase and how it should come from the fundraising account. Motion passed.
- Serhii made a motion to fund the fall requests as voted upon above and to use the reserve to fund the remaining spring requests if needed, Peter seconded. Fall allocations will be made available on July 1st. Spring allocations will be available on January 1. In November, the budgets will be examined to see if they are used in the fall semester. Any unused funds will roll to the next semester but the spring allocation will be decreased based on the amount that was unused in the fall. Motion passed. See attached allocations for specific amounts.
